**Georgia Partnership Coordinator**

The Longleaf Alliance (TLA) is seeking a skilled and motivated Georgia Partnership Coordinator to advance longleaf ecosystem restoration in Georgia. The Longleaf Alliance is a non-profit organization that works throughout the Southeastern U.S. to guide longleaf restoration, stewardship, and conservation using science-based outreach, partnership engagement, and on-the-ground assistance.

The Georgia Partnership Coordinator will conduct outreach activities, deliver technical assistance, and advance other longleaf strategies on behalf of TLA and the Fort Stewart/Altamaha Longleaf Restoration Partnership (FTSA). The FTSA is recognized as one of the Local Implementation Teams (LITs) identified by America's Longleaf Restoration Initiative (ALRI).

**Overview of Duties:**

The Coordinator plays a key role in advancing the strategic initiatives identified by TLA, the FTSA, and other aligned regional partnerships such as the Georgia Sentinel Landscape Partnership. This professional will be directly responsible for coordinating and executing outreach events and activities, growing the number of landowners engaging and participating in longleaf restoration efforts in the LIT and across Georgia, and providing timely and science-based responses to requests for assistance through a variety of methods. The Coordinator works collaboratively with partner organizations and landowners and is expected to be a well-informed, proactive, knowledgeable, helpful, and dependable partner. The Coordinator will also take initiative in other supporting roles such as training and outreach through in-person events and activities, brochures and other written material, webinars, website development, and articles for publication in *The Longleaf Leader*. The Coordinator may also have opportunities to participate in hands-on ecological restoration projects led by FTSA partners such as prescribed fire and groundcover restoration.

**Qualifications:**

Applicants must have a college degree in forestry or a related field and at least three years of experience in outreach, partnership building or coordination, and the management and restoration of longleaf pine. Applicants must have a demonstrated passion for the longleaf ecosystem, an excellent personal and professional reputation, and credibility in the Southeastern US conservation community. A demonstrated ability to create effective relationships with staff, partners, landowners, donors, state and federal agencies, NGOs, and other key constituencies is essential. This position requires strong initiative, organizational and people skills, and excellent written and oral communication skills. Presentation and engagement skills are a must. Leadership will be required for a variety of outreach events. The ideal candidate would have a working knowledge of and/or experience in longleaf forest management and ecology, in the training and teaching of natural resource conservation, and in the broader role of forestland management in the Southeastern United States. An advanced degree in a compatible field is desired.

**Overview of Knowledge, Skills, & Abilities Required:**

- College degree in forestry or related field, with an additional degree in a complementary field preferred.
- Applicants must have at least 3 years of experience in outreach and the management and restoration of longleaf pine ecosystems.
- Ability to collaborate successfully with partner organizations.
- Ability to independently organize and lead complex outreach and training events, as well as work cooperatively as part of large teams.
- Ability to manage multiple grant projects.
- Exceptional logistical skills.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills.
- Teach and compellingly reach audiences from all backgrounds and experience levels.
- Independently manage timely reporting to funding organizations and updating accomplishments.
- Meticulous in organization, recordkeeping, and project management.
- Demonstrate dedication, integrity, and commitment beyond question.
- Proven ability to engage a wide range of stakeholders and supporters.
- Computer fluency especially in the full Microsoft Office suite and ArcGIS Pro.
- Commitment to lifelong learning and advancement of skills.
- Demonstrated initiative and decision-making.
- Impeccable integrity, judgment, commitment, and discretion.
- The physical requirements of the tasks of this position can be strenuous, requiring lifting and carrying of items up to 50 lbs.; the position also requires outdoor work at times in weather conditions ranging from ideal to arduous.
- Maintain accurate record keeping and timely reporting.

**Compensation:**

\$60-65K depending upon experience. Overall compensation includes additional benefits, including paid time off (PTO) and sick leave time, Simple IRA, and a health care stipend

**Location and Travel:**

This position is a remote role and can be based anywhere in Fort Stewart/Altamaha landscape in Georgia, as agreed upon by the candidate and TLA, to support the successful accomplishment of the role. This job will at times require some evening and weekend activities (especially planning and after-action record keeping). Applicant must be willing and able to travel extensively across Georgia. Occasional travel to other states may be required throughout the year for staff meetings, training, and conferences. Applicant must have a driver's license.
